The Use of Articles with Names of Months, Days, Seasons

- I As a rule, they are used without articles.
 - E.g. Ø December, Ø January and Ø February are winter months. Good bye. See you on Ø Tuesday. Most of all I like Ø spring.
- II They are also used with the article (definite/indefinite) according to the general rule.
 - **a/an:** 1. When they are modified by a descriptive attribute.

 E.g. It was <u>a</u> bitter, cold winter with long, hard frosts.
 - 2. When we mean "one of many" (= какой-то, один из...) E.g. Robinson Crusoe found his servant on <u>a</u> Friday.

Note: a/an is not used with names of seasons modified by "early" and "late". E.g. It was \varnothing early spring.

- the: 1. When they are modified by a particularizing attribute.

 E.g. <u>The</u> summer of 1980 was unusually cold.

 I recollect the Monday we met.
 - 2. When the situation makes them definite (= "this" / "that") E.g. In March came the first break in <u>the</u> winter.
